Refresher Workshop of 76 Master Trainers on State ECCE Curriculum

A one-day refresher workshop was conducted to train 25 Anganwadi Educators and 51 Supervisors from Raipur District as Master Trainers in collaboration with the Department of Women and Child Development, Chhattisgarh, as part of the 'Gadhbho Bachpan' Project. The workshop aimed to help Supervisors and Anganwadi Educators revisit the State's Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) curriculum, equipping them to effectively train the remaining Anganwadi Workers in the district. Effective implementation of the ECCE curriculum is a critical step toward supporting the holistic development of children in Raipur District.

Assessment Training of AWWs

A one-day assessment training was conducted for 61 Anganwadi Educators from Raipur District, in collaboration with the Department of Women and Child Development, Chhattisgarh. The purpose of the training was to build a comprehensive understanding of child assessment, its importance and assessment tools for early years. The workshop emphasised on how assessment is an integral part of lesson plan activities. The session also focused on why is it important to assess children in all the domains of development and the need for regular assessments at continuous intervals to support holistic growth of children.





Suposhan Chaupal

'Suposhan Chaupal' was celebrated across 61 Anganwadi Centers across 8 projects in Raipur District. The goal was to enhance parental involvement and increase their participation in Anganwadis. It was a fun filled day where parents participated in the activities that children do at Anganwadi Centres. Parents were informed about the significance of the early years, the ongoing programs at the Anganwadi Centers & ECCE State Curriculum, and encouraged to send their children regularly and on time to ensure continuous engagement in these daily activities.



Training of 1764 Anganwadi Educators

A one-day workshop was held for 1764 Anganwadi Educators (Sector wise) by 105 Master Trainers, across 8 projects from Raipur District, in collaboration with the Department of Women and Child Development, Chhattisgarh, as part of the 'Gadhbho Bachpan' Project. The training session oriented Anganwadi Educators on the implementation of daily lesson plan and the effective use of activity books to provide quality education to all children and promoting their holistic development. The Anganwadi Educators were trained on the key domains of development: Physical, Cognitive, Socio-Emotional, Language and Literacy, and Aesthetics and Cultural Development and how can they work towards each domain of development in their daily Anganwadi routine.





Expansion of 'Gadhbo Bachpan' to 600 more Anganwadis

The 'Gadhbo Bachpan' project, launched in February 2024, initially engaged 61 Anganwadi Centers, 61 Anganwadi Educators, and 75 Supervisors to strengthen Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) in the district. Now in its second phase, the project will expand to 661 Anganwadi Centres across the district. In this phase, Supervisors are positioned as key agents of change. While they will oversee all Anganwadis under their jurisdiction, they will focus specifically on 10 selected Anganwadis within each sector to implement targeted micro-improvement plans.

Training on Foundational Literacy and Numeracy (FLN) Programme

A three-day FLN (Foundational Literacy and Numeracy) training was recently organized for 50 selected schools in Murshidabad. The training focused on enhancing the teaching skills of primary school teachers through hands-on activities and practical strategies.

On the first day, the emphasis was on pedagogy, with discussions around effective teaching methods. The second and third days concentrated on language and mathematics, respectively, providing teachers with tools to improve classroom instruction in these critical areas.

Throughout the sessions, teachers actively participated in developing lesson plans, creating Teaching Learning Materials (TLMs), and designing worksheets. This training not only offered practical takeaways but also served as a valuable platform for teachers to interact and exchange ideas, fostering a collaborative learning environment.





Impact of FLN training at 20 Aluani Primary School

20 Aluani Primary School followed traditional lecture methods to teach a topic in the class and most often the teachers found it difficult to assess whether the children blindly depended on rote learning or understood the concepts clearly. Post FLN-training teachers are motivated to design interactive TLMs, exciting hands-on activities and craft engaging learning experiences based on clearly defined expected learning outcomes as a result of which now it is easier for them to evaluate children's understanding of various Literacy and Numeracy concepts. Children are also taking an active part in the learning process and showing more interest in coming to school regularly.

In the words of the Headmaster, Sri Atish Kumar Mondol, "This training was very helpful. It helped me to understand how easily any subject can be presented which will be accepted by the heart of the students. I hope that if I can teach in this way, every student in my school will reach their desired ability.."



TLM Workshop for Anganwadi Educators

A three-day workshop for 230 Anganwadi Educators from Karnataka's Karwar region, conducted in collaboration with the CII Foundation and supported by Volvo Group! This training empowered educators to craft and use locally made Teaching-Learning Materials (TLMs) to enrich children's learning experiences in Anganwadi centers. Each participant received a TLM Handbook to continue this creative journey, facilitating an engaging and culturally connected learning environment.

Shiksha Samvaad: A Path Towards Education Equity!



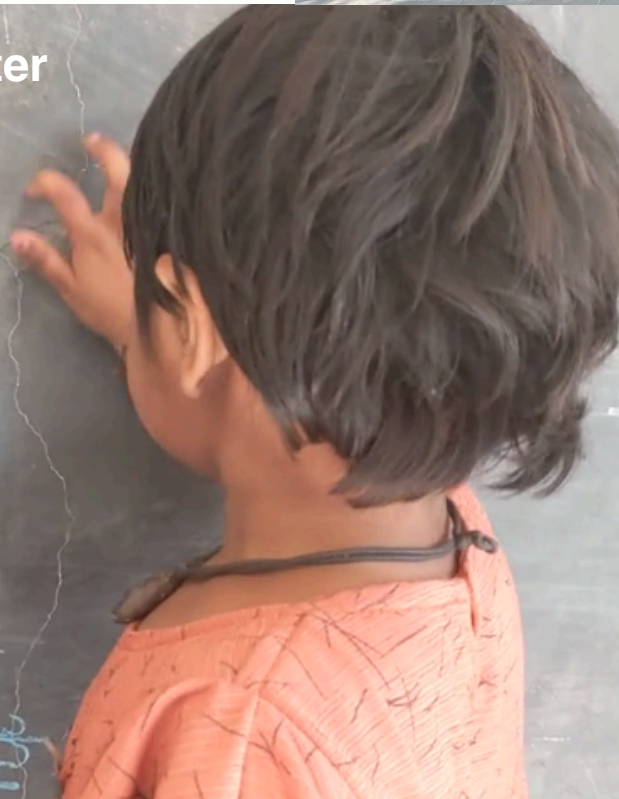
